Outside, take a bowl of water and an old paintbrush. Dip your brush into the water. Can you draw some long lines, short lines, circles and dots? Ask an adult to write the first letter from your name. Can you trace over it? Can you write any letters from your name?</p>	<p>Challenge 3: Can you write a list of your favourite toys and then cut out the names and make labels for them? With your grown-up change one of the characters names in the story. Maybe you could be a character? Read the story again using your own or other made up name for a character.
