Can you talk to your grown up about everything that makes you happy and everything you are thankful for? You could even write them on pieces of paper and make a paper chain of happiness.

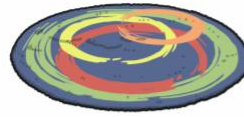
