Important messages for this week:

After School Activities I am writing to inform you that following the start of the second National Lockdown we have now received new guidance in regard to after school clubs. This guidance states that unfortunately we are not permitted under the new restrictions to run any after school clubs for our children. The guidance states that: 'Out-of-school activities (including wraparound care) may continue to operate if their primary purpose is providing registered childcare. All other out of school activities, not being primarily used by parents for these purposes, should close for face-to-face provision for the duration of the national restrictions.' We are very upset and fully understand that the children will be too, especially as staff had put lots of work into ensuring that we could run these in line with the previous Covid guidelines. We hope to get these clubs back up and running as soon as the Government guidelines allow.





EYFS





In nursery the children had a spooky week exploring Halloween activities and then we looked at Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate bonfire night. The children made their own fireworks display using crayon and blowing paint. We had a special treat eating hotdogs and sharing what we like about bonfire night. The children have been discussing what makes them different from each other and that they are all special.



KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

<u>Year 3</u> were WOWED by their muscles. They found out that their body automatically leads with the strongest leg. Try it! You'll be amazed! They hypothesised that people who exercise more, have stronger muscles and it's true! Year 3 know it's true because they put it to the test. Finley, an avid footballer, can do 67 squat jumps before he gets achey legs. How many can you do?

Year 4 have had another busy week this week. In English, we have been writing a set of instructions on what to do when there is a fire. We have been working extremely hard to include linking adverbs, adverbial clauses and make sure all of our writing is in the present tense and chronological order. In Math we have been learning lots about multiplication and division.

We have learned about how to multiply and divide by 0 and 1 and are getting ready to use the gird method for multiplication next week!

We have also learned some more about the Roman's and have begun creating some of our own Roman pottery designs




KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Year 1 have been reading Aliens Love Underpants and have been doing lots of work on adjectives. We have been describing aliens, and also describing pants! We have used words like huge, Little, green, red, wiggly, spotty, stripy. 1BG also used Purple Mash on the laptops to create a poppy for Remembrance Day.





Year 2 have loved talking about the differences between the soldiers in WW1 & 2 and soldiers who serve in our armed forces today. We have discussed their uniforms, the vehicles they drove and what trenches are. We looked at old black and white photos and talked about how they soldiers would have felt. We have read about why poppies are special on Remembrance Day and painted our own poppies.



We have also noticed that we can swap our multiplication sums around and the answer is the same.

KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

This week in <u>Year 5</u>, we have been improving out writing skills by learning all about adverbial clauses, relative clauses and expanded noun phrases. Our current English topic (Rose Blanche) has fit in nicely with remembrance day and we have created some fantastic silhouette artwork.



In maths we have been learning about distributive and commutative law and working hard to improve out mental maths skills.

We have also been practicing our hocky skills, looking at dribbling and now moving onto passing techniques.
