

Reading News:



EYFS

This week the <u>Nursery</u> children have had a great time getting ready for Christmas. The children took part in our Elf day and all looked fabulous in their outfits. The children have also enjoyed creating and preparing our crafts for the Christmas craft sale. We have been all working hard to make our special gifts for you to purchase. The children have enjoyed our new advent calendars in their groups and the chocolates. We have decorated

our Christmas tree and we have a special visitor in nursery called Elfis who is a good elf. The children have enjoyed finding him in different parts of the room. So far he has been reading and writing and decorating a tree.

KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

We have been tackling some very tricky bus stop division problems In Maths, but have conquered these with great determination. KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Year 1 have been learning about materials in science. Can we find things made of wood, plastic, metal, glass, fabric? How do we know it is made of those things? What can we say about those objects? Are they hard, soft, smooth, see through, bumpy, bendy? We have sorted materials by what they are made of, and also by their properties. We have also been trying really hard in our phonics every day, and our new sounds this week were: ur (fur), ew (blew) and au (launch). They are definitely tricky ones to remember!



Year 2 have researched and designed their own bug hotels this week.

We had lots of fun gathering sticks, leaves and bark to encourage minibeasts into their new home.

In math's we have continued our learning on fractions, finding halves, quarters and thirds of quantities, making sure they are all equal.


In English the children have described a new dragon
