Mindset Lunch Club



EYFS

Nursery have enjoyed their Forest Schools sessions which are based around the story The Leaf Thief. This week we collected lots of leaves and spoke about how they looked "spikey", "crumply" and "prickly". When we tipped the bag of leaves out, we could smell something, some of us thought the smell of the leaves was disgusting but someone had a great idea and thought the smell was "like green and grass."





F2 have enjoyed exploring our vehicle this week. We went for a learning walk to explore the local area. We went over the bridge and looked at the cars below, we loved to see people waving at us from their cars! We had an exciting time at forest schools this week, we even found a duck egg! The children were intrigued to look and feel the egg and investigate it further.







KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Last week the children in **Year 2** completed their first piece of extended writing. It was their own version of the 'Who Swallowed Stanley' story. The children enjoyed writing about sea creatures who attacked poor Stanley and the boy who saved him.





KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have continued their research this week about how the Stone Age people hunted and gathered their food. The children discovered how much impact the changes in weather had on the land and the sea and consequently their diet. 


Year 4 have been reading about housing in the Roman period this week. They had to say what was similar and different from the Stone Age. Their recall of information from last year was very good. Well done everyone!

KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

This week in our Science lessons, **Y5** have been learning about the lifecycles of a mammal and comparing this to the lifecycle of a plant. In Maths, we are moving onto addition and subtraction and learning how to do this mentally using strategies such as counting on and counting back. Next week, we are going to explore the role of Bletchley Park in WW2 and who Alan Turing was.

This week, **Year 6** have been on fire, working so hard on division. We have moved on from dividing by a single digit using the bus stop method to long division dividing by two digits. This involves fact boxes and repeated subtraction until the answer is calculated. Well done Year 6. We are proud of
