

EYFS

We have been super busy in **F1** this week, we have started a new book called the Leaf Thief and talked about how the wind blows the leaves off the trees at autumn time. We collected loads up and made some super wreaths with them and even did some leaf rubbings too using pastels. Inside the classroom we did some printing using potatoes using autumn colours. Miss Taylor loved our work so much she has made a display of it. Isn't our work amazing!







The children in **F2** this week have been talking about their local communities and where they live. They have then transferred their ideas onto a local map drawing lots of different things that they would see on their way to school. We have seen things like parks, train tracks, fields, zebra crossings and traffic lights. The children have used long rolls of paper, chalk, and paint to express their ideas. We have seen some wonderful detail added to their maps.







KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have been busy writing their end outcome to The Stone Age Boy in English this week. We have had to think right back to Year 2 recalling our knowledge of capital letters, full stops and adjectives to ensure we include lots of the detail in our story. One focus was to include similes and they have tried so hard: it was as cold as ice, as dark as midnight, I ran as fast as a cheetah and I snuggled up like a baby. Year 4 have been busy writing their end outcome in English which links with the battle of Pompei. Their use of fronted adverbials – On a hillside, Overlooking the beautiful city, have really enhanced the detail in their writing. Using similes has also helped to add more depth and emotion to their story writing too – I sat alone as still as a statue, the people were running to safety like a swarm of bees.
