The programme has also led to more dogs being adopted by animal shelters in the surrounding area.



'Wonky' beauty items saved from landfill A new company in the UK is aiming to

reduce cosmetic waste by reselling the 90 million beauty products thrown away in the UK each year. "A huge number of eauty products are destroyed each year by manufacturers and retailers without ever hitting the market," says Yasmine Amr, founder of Boop. They include products with printing errors or discontinued items.



Robot football

A group of more than 20 researchers at Google DeepMind in London have taught two robots to play football, using a technique called deep reinforcement. "Robot football is both fun and serious science," say the researchers.



TikTok star sets record for arm knitting

ned Knitter Dan soar, known as the Tatt on TikTok, has set a new world record and raised money for charity by arm knitting 19 blankets in 24 hours. The TikTok star originally started arm kitting to help with his anxiety, as it can be a fun and mindful way to relax. Dan's challenge was watched by a whopping 1.2 million people and raised around £3,000 for charities. Arm knitting is just like regular knitting, except using your arms instead of needles!



SOS sign saves stranded sailors

Three men who were stranded on a remote island in the Pacific Ocean were rescued after spelling the word 'HELP' in palm tree leaves. The sailors were found by the US Coastguard on a tiny, deserted island called Pikelot Atoll, one of more than 600 islands that form the region of Micronesia. The group had been stranded for 9 days after setting off on a sailing trip from the Us, they were reported missing by family after failing to return. All three men are said to be doing well!

Water fight for happiness People at an ethnic village in southwest china have celebrated the annual water

splashing festival! They splash water on one another during the festival to symbolise the washing away of bad luck and bringing good luck. In Yunnan province of China, the Water Splashing Festival is celebrated by the Dai ethnic group which is one of the 55 ethnic minorities in China The whole celebration usually starts on the 13th of April and takes 3-7 days.



Fossil may belong to biggest ever sea creature

Last week, 11 year old Ruby Reynolds and her father were walking along a beach in Somerset, UK, when they found fossilised bones of a gigantic prehistoric sea creature. The jawbones are thought to belong to the largest marine reptile ever discovered - the ichthyosaur - that lived during the time of the dinosaurs. Palaeontologists say the bones are about 202 million years old and date back to the end of the Triassic Period.



Scientists are listening to sail to find out how to keep it healthy. In the first study of its kind, researchers are using a technique called 'ecoacoustics' to listen to the activity of earthworms and other things living beneath the soil's surface. They say the noisier the soil, the healthier it is!


Poo fuel takes flight
