

The Tibetan Wail

The Tibetan wail is a special way of singing. People sing very high and hold long notes to show their deep feelings. This singing style is from traditional Tibetan music, which is part of Tibetan Buddhism. In their chants and songs, they use this singing to feel closer to the spiritual world.

Tibetan Traditions

Alan grew up in Kangding, a city in a part of China called Tibet. In Tibetan culture, people do not usually have family names. A Buddhist teacher gives children their names. "A Buddhist monk chose Dawa Dolma for me, which means 'a heavenly maiden of the moon.'"

Music Competition

In 2006, a big music company from Japan looked for a new singer in Beijing, the capital city of China. Over 40,000 people wanted to be chosen, but they picked Alan. This was the start of her journey to becoming a star!

Learning the Erhu

The erhu is a special Chinese instrument with two strings and a bow. It's very old and was first played in China a long, long time ago. Alan learned to play it and still plays it in her shows today.
