Enrichment through Educational Visits, Residential Trips or Curriculum Workshops

At Holgate Primary and Nursery School, we aim to bring excellence and enjoyment into our children’s education in order for them to grow a love of learning and to excel. One way in which our school provides for these moments is through educational visits, which invite children to discover new places, new people, and new experiences in different and exciting ways.

Taking children outside of their classroom setting provides them with the opportunity to see things in context, have new experiences and be inspired. We believe that a residential visit provides children with multiple benefits. They develop independence, improve confidence and self-esteem, establish strong relationships, motivate children, and allows them to create lifelong memories. At Holgate we aim to provide residential experiences across years 2-year 6. 





Enrichment through our club offer

Enrichment and Support through our Pastoral Offer

At Holgate Primary and Nursery School, we aim to promote positive mental health and wellbeing of every member of our school community and recognise how important mental health and wellbeing is to our lives, as is physical health. We recognise that children’s mental health and overall wellbeing can affect their learning and achievement.

A key aspect of our role in school is to ensure that children can manage times of change and stress, and that they are supported to reach their potential or access help when they need it. We also have a role to ensure that children learn about what they can do to maintain positive mental health, what affects their mental health, how they can help reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues, and where they can go if they need help and support.

Positive wellbeing is promoted through the wider curriculum and all school activities. Through a carefully planned approach to PSHE, RSE and Citizenship our pupils are helped to acquire the knowledge and develop the skills and understanding they need to lead confident, healthy, independent lives, and to become resilient, informed and responsible citizens.
