## Key Songs

Sweet Dreams (Are Made of This)	1983 - The first big hit for the Eurythmics that with a synth-pop sound.
Here Comes the Rain Again	1984 - Another Eurythmics track showcasing Lennox's powerful vocals.
Walking on Broken Glass	1992 - A critically acclaimed single blending pop and classical elements.
No More "I Love You's"	1986 - This song won a special international music award called a 'Grammy'.
Sing	2007 - A collaboration with 23 female artists, raising awareness for a disease called AIDS.

## The Importance of Lennox

### Synth-Pop and Fashion

The Eurythmics made a new kind of music that mixed electronic and pop sounds using keyboards and synths. Annie Lennox also wore costumes that didn't follow the rules about what girls or boys should wear.

### The Circle

In 2003, Annie Lennox started helping people a lot. She made a group called "The Circle" to support girls and problems such as when others are not treated fairly.

## Famous Events

### OBE

Annie Lennox got a special award called an OBE from the Queen in 2011. OBE stands for "Order of the British Empire." It is an award given by the British monarch to individuals for their hard work for being very good at helping others.

### Still Recording Today

Annie Lennox is still recording music now. Her latest work includes a Christmas album and an album of her favourite jazz songs.
