



## Enrichment offer at Holgate Primary and Nursery School

At Holgate Primary and Nursery School, we constantly seek to promote the extensive personal development of pupils during their time with us. Our pupils have access to a wide, rich set of experiences from EYFS to Year 6 including whole school opportunities and bespoke class and individual opportunities. Opportunities for pupils to develop their talents and interests are of a good quality. These rich experiences are planned through both curriculum enrichment and Extra-Curricular opportunities. Through our Enrichment Offer, we aim to promote students' spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development. These are defined as:

### Spiritual

The spiritual development of pupils is shown by their:

- ability to be reflective about their own beliefs (religious or otherwise) and perspective on life.
- knowledge of, and respect for, different people's faiths, feelings, and values
- sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others, and the world around them
- use of imagination and creativity in their learning  
willingness to reflect on their experiences.

### Social

The social development of pupils is shown by their:

- use of a range of social skills in different contexts, for example working and socialising with other pupils, including those from different religious, ethnic, and socio-economic backgrounds
- willingness to participate in a variety of communities and social settings, including by volunteering, cooperating well with others and being able to resolve conflicts effectively.
- acceptance and engagement with the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs; they develop and demonstrate skills and attitudes that will allow them to participate fully in and contribute positively to life in modern Britain.

### Moral

The moral development of pupils is shown by their:

- ability to recognise the difference between right and wrong and to readily apply this understanding in their own lives, recognise legal boundaries and, in so doing, respect the civil and criminal law of England.
- understanding of the consequences of their behaviour and actions
- interest in investigating and offering reasoned views about moral and ethical issues and ability to understand and appreciate the viewpoints of others on these issues.

### Cultural

The cultural development of pupils is shown by their:

- understanding and appreciation of the wide range of cultural influences that have shaped their own heritage and that of others.
- understanding and appreciation of the range of different cultures in the school and further afield as an essential element of their preparation for life in modern Britain
- ability to recognise, and value, the things we share in common across cultural, religious, ethnic, and socio-economic communities.
- knowledge of Britain's democratic parliamentary system and its central role in shaping our history and values, and in continuing to develop Britain.
- willingness to participate in and respond positively to artistic, musical, sporting, and cultural opportunities.
- interest in exploring, improving understanding of and showing respect for different faiths and cultural diversity and the extent to which they understand, accept and respect diversity. This is shown by their respect and attitudes towards different religious, ethnic and socio-economic groups in the local, national and global communities.

At Holgate, our Enrichment offer is layered into the curriculum offer, wider whole school offer, parental and community engagement, pupil leadership and extra-curricular opportunities. Details of these can be found on the following pages:







## Enrichment through our club offer





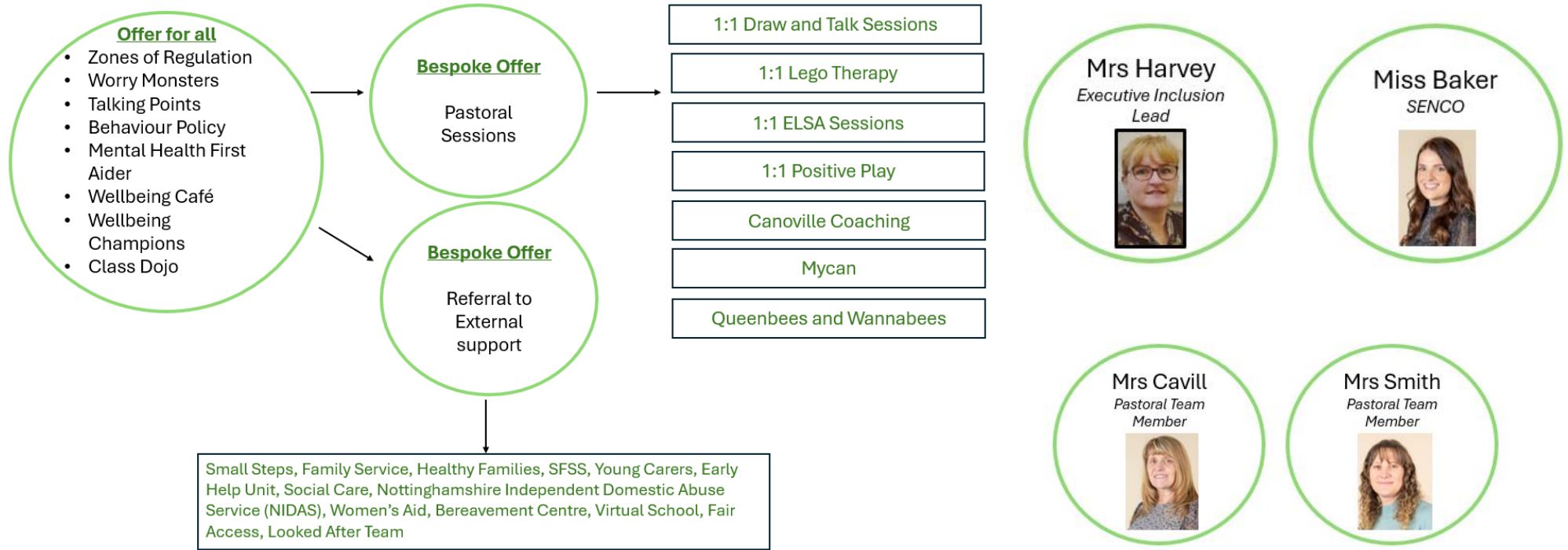
## Enrichment and Support through our Pastoral Offer

At Holgate Primary and Nursery School, we aim to promote positive mental health and wellbeing of every member of our school community and recognise how important mental health and wellbeing is to our lives, as is physical health. We recognise that children’s mental health and overall wellbeing can affect their learning and achievement.

A key aspect of our role in school is to ensure that children can manage times of change and stress, and that they are supported to reach their potential or access help when they need it. We also have a role to ensure that children learn about what they can do to maintain positive mental health, what affects their mental health, how they can help reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues, and where they can go if they need help and support.






Positive wellbeing is promoted through the wider curriculum and all school activities. Through a carefully planned approach to PSHE, RSE and Citizenship our pupils are helped to acquire the knowledge and develop the skills and understanding they need to lead confident, healthy, independent lives, and to become resilient, informed and responsible citizens.

In addition to the curriculum, we also have a broad bespoke pastoral offer to support children and families when needed. This includes:



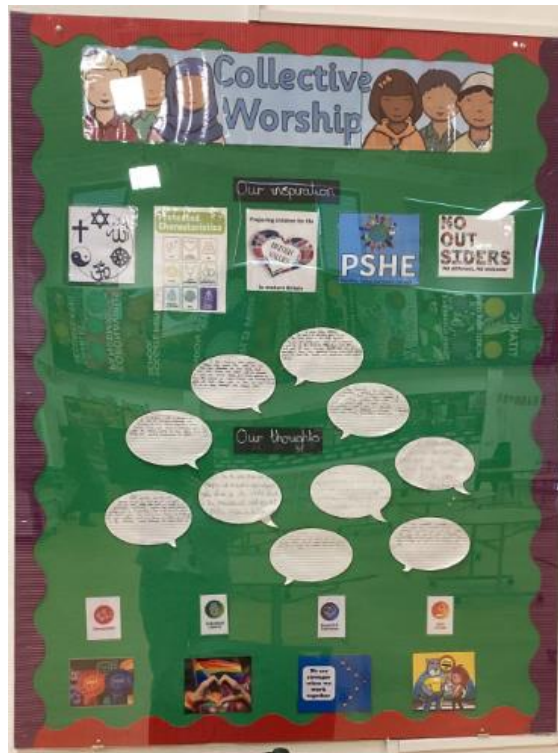
## Enrichment through a pupil leadership

## Enrichment through Collective Worship and Assemblies:

Our assemblies promote children's spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development, and help to guide our children on how to become well-rounded individuals and global citizens. Our Assembly Overviews ensure that we offer a range of assemblies with a broad focus. - DEIB Assemblies – DEIB assemblies are prepared and delivered by our class teachers or senior leaders and aim to bring our school community together in collective worship. Our aim is to ensure we are working together to equip our children with the understanding and knowledge to be well-rounded, global citizens who have a good understanding of Fundamental British Values and Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging.
- PRIDE Assemblies – Weekly celebration assemblies are led by our senior leaders. The aims of these assemblies are to celebrate the successes of our pupils as a school community and to promote excellence in all elements of our behaviour. Children are nominated weekly for PRIDE awards for showing excellence in their work, behaviour or attitudes. Each half term through class votes the children are democratically selected as their classes PRIDE winner.
- Parent DEIB Assemblies – Each year, every year group has the opportunity to perform in front of their parents/carers. Each year group will focus on a different protected characteristic and will work with their class teacher to develop an informative and engaging assembly. These assemblies promote our pupils' speaking and listening development and provide the opportunity for pupils to practise the virtues of courage, collaboration, and creativity.
- Visitor Assemblies – Throughout the year, a variety of visitors may lead on assemblies to raise awareness or to educate. Visitors have included representatives from The Dogs' Trust, The local Church, Severn Trent Water, Professional musicians and other organisations.

# 30 things to do before you leave Holgate Primary...

Motivated by our desire to provide children with a richness of experiences beyond the classroom, we have created a list of 30 things to do before leaving Holgate Primary School. The aim of this is to ensure that our children have the childhood experiences that all young people deserve. All experiences have been woven into the curriculum or wider enrichment offer to ensure that every single pupil completes all 30 things by the time they leave us at the end of primary school, some of them many, many times over.

When children achieve their first 10 things, they are awarded with a **Bronze Award** which is a certificate awarded in our Whole School Celebration Assembly.

When children have achieved 20 of the 30 things, they are awarded with a **Silver Award** which is a certificate awarded in our Whole School Celebration Assembly along with a voucher entitling the children to a half term's free after-school enrichment club of their choice. This offer will support children in achieving their Gold Award or will enable them to broaden their cultural capital.

When children achieve their **Gold Award**, parents are invited into school to see them received their Golden Certificate and Medal.
