A Day in Year 1

Every day in Year 1 the children have lots of different teaching and learning opportunities. We do a daily routine:

- Assemblies
- Daily mile This is where the children have an 15 mins outside hopefully running or jogging a mile. This is to promote fitness and well being.
- Maths We always start the lesson with a 5 minute mental maths session to promote quick recall. Over the week we also have target and times table lessons.
- Phonics We use Jolly Phonics to build on our learning from EYFS.
- English Skills Covering Y1 grammar e.g. nouns, full stops, capital letters
- Story time we always finish the day with a story.

A Day in Year 1

- Vehicle Each half term will cover some objectives from history, geography, science, art, and D&T. They will use their English skills throughout. This half term is Fur, Feathers and Scales
- Music, computing, PE, RE and PSHE will be taught separately unless elements are included in the vehicle.
- Y1 still has some play based learning so it will be familiar to EYFS. We have construction, roleplay/ small world, a reading area, a writing area, a maths area, and a creative area. To expand children's learning there are some challenges every fortnight for them to try and complete independently in reading, writing and maths.

Weekly Events in Year 1

On Monday: Mrs Humphreys is 1HO teacher (and covers PPA in both classes) Monday to Wednesday in 1BG is Mrs Barnes Thursday and Friday in 1BG is Mrs Grimwade

P.E twice a week. 1BB on Monday and Thursday

1HO on Wednesday and Thursday

It is important that the children have their P.E kit with them on all days as the P.E days above can change. Children need to have earrings removed before coming to school on this day.


On a Friday: the children go to the whole school Golden Mentions assembly to celebrate good learning and behavior across school.

The children swap their books once a week. They get a reading raffle ticket for reading 3 times.

English Expectations Reading

- Please ensure book bags are in school with books and reading diaries every day
- Never put water bottles in your book bag please as they leak.
- We ask that you read with your child at least 3 times a week, if they do this they will receive a raffle ticket to add to the reading jar.
- Always talk to your child about what they have read. Did they understand it?
- Your child will have a sticker to help you with this relevant to their reading book band in their diary.

The end of year reading expectation for Year 1 is **turquoise** books




A micro-sized Tiger crawled under the door. He had never been in the staffroom before. It was a bit scary. He looked all around hoping to see the sparkly earring.

Phonics Screening Check

This test will be done in June 2019. Your child will need to read 40 real and nonsense words. They will need to practise their sounds at home as they must be very confident at identifying letter sounds and at decoding words.

The pass mark for the last few years has been 32. This test is extremely important and they will need to resit the test in Year 2 if they do not pass in Year 1.

There will be a phonics workshop on Tuesday 24th September at 9am where you can come and find out more about Y1 phonics and play some phonics games with your child.

Writing Expectations

- Spell words using the phonemes they already know.
- Spell tricky.
- Spell the days of the week and numbers in words.
- Adding prefixes (un-) and suffixes (-ed -ing).
- Handwriting must be neat and begin to show simple joins.
- Write sentences compose orally, sequences sentences and check it makes sense.
- Write sentences from memory.
- Use conjunctions (and, so, but, or).
- Use punctuation correctly. (full stops, question marks)
- Use capital letters correctly at the beginning of a sentence and for names
- English Vocabulary to know

Maths Expectations

- Count to 100.
- Read and write numbers to 100.
- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Identify 1 more and 1 less.
- Write numbers 1-20 in words.
- Know number bonds of 20.
- Add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers to 20.
- Solve 1 step addition and subtraction problems.
- Solve 1 step multiplication and division problems.
- Recognise halves and quarters of shapes and quantities.
- Understand measurement (length, weight, capacity, time).
- Know 2D and 3D shapes.
- Describe position, movement and direction

Maths Vocabulary to know

More than, less than, more, fewer, most, least time vocabulary - days, weeks, months, o'clock and half past. Add, subtract, multiply, times, divide, share. Facts place value Quantity Pattern and shape $+ - = x \div$
