<p><b>Challenge 1:</b> Can you make a set of number cards from 0-10 and order them to make a number line? Ask someone to hide them around your home and go on a number hunt. Can you add objects to the numeral? If you find number 4 on your number hunt, can you match 4 objects to the number card?</p>	<p><b>Challenge 2:</b> Draw your own 10s frame (make sure you have 10 squares!) and find 10 objects to help you solve these problems... 1+2= 3+1= 5+1= 3+2= 3+3= Now can you make your own number sentence? Maybe you could try taking away too!</p> <div data-bbox="767 297 951 374" style="text-align: center;"> </div>	<p><b>Challenge 3:</b> Can you make a pattern using your toys? You could use your Lego or building bricks to make a repeating pattern – red, blue, red, blue. You might want to use cutlery and make a more challenging pattern – knife, fork, spoon, spoon, knife, fork, spoon, spoon. What items could you use? How many different patterns can you make?</p>

<p><b>Challenge 1:</b> Use the map to help you think of a sentence to write. What is happening in storyland? Where are the characters doing? Can you say your sentence out loud? Can you count the number of words in your sentence? Can you write the sentence? (Remember your capital letters, finger spaces and full stop!)</p>	<p><b>Challenge 3:</b> Can you write a letter to your teacher to tell them what you have been doing? This can then be photographed and sent to the class teacher via the class email. Your teacher would love to see!</p>

(Like this...chain)</p>	<p><b>Challenge 2:</b> Share a book with your grown up.  Can you find any of these tricky words in the book – <b>he she was of to.</b></p>	<p><b>Challenge 3:</b> Get your favourite story book and draw your favourite character or characters! Can you write their names? What initial sound can you hear? Can you hear anymore sounds? When you've written their name, can you label other things, such as their eyes, nose, shoes etc.</p>
