


Maths

Number Challenge 1

Following on from last week, using the playing cards to have fun with math's. This week can you complete the following:

Using the playing cards 2,3, 4, 5 and 6 (of any suit)

1. Use 2 cards and make a number greater than 50
2. Use 2 cards and make a number less than 30
3. Use 2 cards and make an even number or an odd number
4. Use 2 cards and make a number between 47 and 59



If you are feeling a little smarter, can you;

1. Make the smallest 2 digit number?
2. Make the largest 2 digit number?
3. Using all the cards what is the largest number you can make?
4. Using all the cards what is the smallest number you can make?

Challenge 2

Again using some simple cards, but this time can you make your own? These can be pictures, shapes or even cut outs from a magazine or catalogue. Can you;

1. Make a repeating pattern, only using 2 different cards
2. Make a repeating pattern using 3 different cards
3. Make a pattern using all the cards
4. Make a repeating patterns, using 2 cards, but this time 2 of the same pictures need to be together

Writing

The writing challenges this week have been split into two sessions and is based upon BBC Bitesize's Daily Lessons for Year 1 (the days for each session are previous dates on BBC Bitesize). We have included a summary here of the learning that will take place and a link for each session on the Bitesize page. Each of the sessions are flexible and could be done at your child's own pace (e.g. over more than one day). It is also important to point out that you don't have to stick exactly to the instructions in the activities (e.g. don't think that you have to write five sentences – do what you think your child can do).

Session 1

To write sentences using capital letters (includes: an introduction to capital letters and full stops, a song about caterpillars and three activities to try at home).

Activity 1: Writing short sentences about caterpillars

Activity 2: Pretend you are a caterpillar and writing sentences about what you could be doing. **(Words to include leaf, cocoon, butterfly and flapping)**

Activity 3: Make a caterpillar dance using your whole body and then teach it to someone else.

Session 2

To write a fact file about minibeasts using nouns and joining words (conjunctions) to make sentences more interesting (includes: a video about nouns and an introduction to joining words (conjunctions), a video about minibeasts and three activities to try at home).

Activity 1: Make a list of sentences about different minibeasts you saw in the video.

Activity 2: Making a fact file – choose three minibeasts, give each one a name and write a sentence for each using the word 'and' to link together.

Reading

Write the letters of your name down on a piece of paper.

Activity 1) Can you find things in your house or in the garden that begins with each letter of your name?

Activity 2) using the letters from your name see how many other words you can make. Are there any key words? (the list in your reading diary) what is the longest word that you can make.

Talk about if you climbed the faraway tree what the world would be like at the top. Would it be a world made of chocolate, or a world where everyone walked backwards? Draw a picture of the Tree with your world at the top and right labels, captions or sentences to describe it.

Flashback task

In the Autumn term we were learning a vehicle all about Traditional Tales, particularly Jack and the Beanstalk and Rapunzel. We challenge you to;

Using things you would find in your garden (leaves and twigs). Can you make a real life beanstalk? Some additional challenges are; The Beanstalk must stand up tall, like the story and needs to be green.
