Perimeter: Recap: Perimeter is the total distance around the outside of a 2D shape. To work out the perimeter of a 4-sided shape you must add together the length of all its sides. E.g. if a square has a side length of 5cm, you would need calculate 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 or (5 x 4). If a rectangle had 2 sides of 3cm and 2 of 5cm, you would need to calculate 3 + 3 + 5 + 5 to work out its perimeter. Task: Go around your house and discover a 2D shape with 4 sides. Use a ruler to measure each side and calculate its perimeter. You should search to try and find something with the largest perimeter. Challenge: Can you record your findings in a table of results?
