The aim of **Safer Internet Day** is to inspire a national conversation about using technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively.

This year **Safer Internet Day** will focus on how consent works in an online context and will ask young people to explore how they ask, give, and receive consent online. This could be in their friendships or relationships, how they take and share images and videos or how they manage their privacy and data.

The campaign encourages young people to explore how the internet works, who owns the information that is shared on it, and how they can actively take ownership of digital spaces.

We want **Safer Internet Day** to empower young people to take control of their online lives and to feel that they can harness and use the positive power of the internet for good.
