The Feel Good Family Factor:

Today marks the end of Mental Health Week 2021. Nature has been the theme this year. Why? Mental Health Uk say :

During long months of the pandemic, millions of us turned to nature. Our [research on the mental health impacts of the pandemic](#) showed going for walks outside was one of our top coping strategies and 45% of us reported being in green spaces had been vital for our mental health. Websites which showed footage from webcams of wildlife saw hits increase by over 2000%. Wider studies also found that during lockdowns, people not only spent more time in nature but were noticing it more.







EYFS

This week in **Nursery** as part of our vehicle we have carried on our camping theme and looked at making a campfire. This was a great opportunity to teach the children about fire safety at forest school and the importance of following the rules when sitting around our fire circle. The children learned how to ask to enter the fire circle walking around and sitting down and then turning away from the fire when leaving. We learnt some new words including tinder and kindle which we used to make the fire. We showed the children the flint and how it made a spark to start the fire. This is all working towards us cooking on the campfire in a few weeks.



In **EYFS** we have continued looking into the different holiday choices for Wicket the dog...this week we have been looking at holidays abroad. We talked about needing passports and we made our own, writing about ourselves. We spent time looking at airports and what it would be like to travel on a plane and we had a visit from Mrs Kelly to tell us all about her previous job as a Flight Attendant. The children really enjoyed learning about what a Flight Attendant would do, they had lots of questions! Mrs Kelly showed all the children how to do the safety demonstration that would show where the exits are. All the children enjoyed having a visitor.



KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Today **1HO** have been using different parts of their bodies to travel along the hall and equipment. They had to move with control and safety. This including, running, crawling, walking backwards and weaving through cones.



The children in **Y2** have been learning all about the problems that pollution causes in the oceans. Jessica, Charlotte and Jack decided they wanted to spread the word around Hucknall and produced some brilliant posters to highlight the need to Reuse, Recycle and Reduce. Their posters have been put up in the Co-op and Sainsburys supermarkets.





They are really keen to make a difference by reducing, re-using and recycling.

KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have been working really hard on their French skills this week. Learning all about different fruits in French and how to pronounce them correctly. They have been chatting with their friends about which fruits they like and dislike. In music, the children have been learning all about musical notation and are beginning to learn where the different notes sit on a staff and how this affects the pitch of music.



This week **year 4** have been working hard writing their own spooky stories, based on the recent Goosebumps, class read. We certainly have some good imaginations and the teachers best not read some just before bedtime.



We have also been finishing off our vehicle on sound, recording our on VLOGS explaining all about how sound works, we all really enjoyed this activity



KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

Year 5 In English, the children have been reading the book 'Epic Adventure' by the author Tom Gates over the last three weeks. They completed their work by writing their own 'Epic Adventures'. The children have wild imaginations - playing tag in Ikea, being chased by snakes at the zoo, camping adventures and getting stuck on a roller coaster. I think you will agree that we have some very impressive authors. Well done to Kellan, Jacie, Ethan and Harry D.



Year 6 have worked incredibly hard this week looking at shape. We know what perpendicular and parallel lines are. Did you know that some shapes have both types of lines? Also, we have been continuing our work on plastics and how we can help reduce plastic usage. We know why it is potentially harmful and we're building up to some persuasive writing!
