In **EYFS** this week we have been continuing looking at different types of holidays so that we can help Wicket the dog make his choice on where he would like to go! We have been looking at seaside holidays this week. We have spoken about the kinds of activities we can do at the seaside, and we also looked at what seaside holidays were like in the past...the children loved learning about what the Victorian children wore to the beach. KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

This week <u>Year 1</u> were set the challenge to make greenhouses out of straws and cling film. This wasn't easy as you can see!!!! However, a big well done goes to Harsharn, Ollie, Summer, Freddie, Madeline, Sophie, Joshua, Max, Darcy, Darcie-Rae, Noah, Oscar and Jeremiah for fantastic teamwork in making their greenhouses which were able to stand up. In Year 2 we have been learning all about the oceans and the problem of pollution in our seas. We can name the 5 oceans and 7 continents, and we know that the ocean is made up of different layers and that different creatures live in each layer. We have learnt about the rubbish islands that exist in the ocean. These look like huge pieces of land but are actually made up of rubbish! We were very sad to learn that all this rubbish is killing many of the animals that live in the ocean. We decided to collect lots of plastic rubbish and make our own sea creature to show what some sea animals are eating.







KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have been set a challenge by Mrs Fitzpatrick to paint a daffodil. Specifically, we had to think about showing the different textures of the flower by using different sizes of brush and different painting techniques. We've thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to get creative this week!





KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

<u>Year 5</u> have been busy researching famous astronomers and finding out more about the planets.

Did you know that Sir Isaac Newton was born so prematurely that he wasn't expected to live for more than 24hrs but he actually lived until 84! Caroline Herschel was the first woman to be paid as an astronomer and has a crater named after her on the moon.

We also worked out how old we would be if we lived on other planets as they take different amount of years or days to orbit the sun.

On Mercury, most children would be 37yrs old as it only takes 88 days. Mrs Hicklin, however, didn't like the idea of being 178 years old! (work that one out (3))
