KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Year 1

In year 1 we have started an English unit inspired by Luke Temple's blubber monster. We have created our own monsters with fish heads, used adjectives to describe them, and thought about where they live. This week we are planning a story about our monster on an adventure. We are going to remember our sentence writing skills – using capital letters, full stops, and making sure it makes sense! We also started their vehicle 'Glorious Gardens' last week by talking about what could go in a garden, what they had in their garden, and if they could plan a garden what would they put in it! Here are some of our garden plans.







Year 2

The children in Y2 have been learning about the oceans around the world. We have learnt about all the problems that rubbish, especially plastic rubbish, causes in the oceans. We carried out an experiment to understand the effects of oil pollution in the sea. We poured some vegetable oil into a foil dish and then used paper towels, and cotton wool balls to try to soak up the oil. We found that this would take a very long time. We then poured some washing up liquid onto the oil and noticed how it broke the oil up into smaller blobs and this made it easier to soak it up.





KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

This week,

Mrs. Bond - an outside P.E provider - has been coming into school to teach <u>Year 3</u> some gymnastic skills. This week the children were perfecting their balancing skills using different parts of their body and working in groups. Wow! some fantastic shapes they made.







This week, **year 4** have worked extremely hard on our Math's and English assessments. We have continued our exciting vehicle work all about sound and have learnt how to change the volume and pitch of sounds. In PE, we have loved our outdoor work on tennis and have put our dance moves to the test when learning the Charleston



KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

This week in **year 5**, we have been busy learning lots about converting measurements (cm, m, mm, miles and km) in Math's and we have been working hard when practising our times tables. In English, we have been taking a closer look at 'Tom Gates - An epic adventure' and finding all the different language features within it. We are excited to start writing our outcome next week! We have also started a new and exciting book in reading lessons called 'Skin taker'. We have been using our excellent inference skills to determine the theme of the book based on its title. We have also been learning about lots of new planets in science.

This week, in Art, <u>Year 6</u> have been creative by drawing and painting their own daffodils based on photos of real daffodils. Don't they look amazing?

In Science, we have started exploring light. Firstly, we explored how light travels in straight lines using paper and torches to prove this. After that, we discovered how we see where we learnt about the different parts of an eye. 6IR and 6ED were amazed that the eye sees things upside down and that it is our brain that flips it the right way up!
