To support children's reading development we have purchased a new reading programme called Bug Club which we will be using as our Home Reading platform for the foreseeable future. Bug Club is is a finely-levelled reading scheme, which ensures that all children can read books at exactly the right level for them.



If you have access to an internet connection, your child can enjoy reading Bug Club books online. Each child has a unique homepage and can log into it by following these steps:

- 1. Go to www.activelearnprimary.co.uk
- 2. Enter login details **these will be stuck into your child's pupil organiser** including our school specific code **amlp**
- 3. Your child's homepage will appear and on here will be their reading book(s).

Throughout the books, there are quiz questions for your child to complete. When your child has finished all the quiz questions in a book, they will earn 'Active Learn Coins'. By reading more books, your child will earn enough coins to 'buy' a reward in one of the many reward schemes.

We have learnt the story, role-played, made masks, re-told as a class group and made our own story maps to help us tell the story. We are ending the week by changing the characters in the story to make our own versions and in **F2** we are going to have a go at writing our stories!











# KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

We have been growing all sorts in <u>Y1</u> as part of our vehicle Glorious Gardening. ## KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

This week, Year 3 have begun work on their new vehicle after creating an amazing Stone Age museum last half term. This half term, the children will be learning all about different foods and how they are produced. By the end of the half term, they will have created their very own burger that will be judged in school by a special guest. In math's, the children are working on adding and subtracting mass and will finish their work on time in the coming weeks. In English, the children will be looking at a myth and work on writing their very own version at the end of the unit. In PE, the children have been learning to play rounders and been taking part in Boxercise lessons with Miss Bond.

This week, in Math's, <u>Year 4</u> have been busy learning about co-ordinates and translation. We played a game of Battleships using our knowledge of co-ordinates, drew different 2D shapes onto co-ordinate grids and moved shapes from one place on a co-ordinate grid to another.

In Reading, we have read a poem about a phantom who loses his head! We have been unpicking this poem using our retrieval and inference skills to find out more about this spooky spectre.

For PE, we have practised our Relayrace skills. Each week, we will be looking at a different athletic skill including Javelin, Shotput and Sprinting.



Year 5 had so much fun having a drumming taster session. They followed along very carefully, counting the beat using their own drumsticks and drumming pads, hitting it soft, hard, fast and slow. Very impressive cool kids!





On Tuesday afternoon, Pete from Nottingham Trent University, came to visit <u>Year 6</u>. Pete told us all about university life, how to get into university, how it is financially affordable for everyone thanks to student loans and what types of courses and activities we could study. We learned about the types of jobs that need a degree too. Afterwards, we spoke to Becky and James, who are two students from the university studying Education and Law.
