Bug Club is is a finely-levelled reading scheme, which ensures that all children can read books at exactly the right level for them.



If you have access to an internet connection, your child can enjoy reading Bug Club books online. Each child has a unique homepage and can log into it by following these steps:

- 1. Go to www.activelearnprimary.co.uk
- 2. Enter login details these will be stuck into your child's pupil organiser including our school specific code amlp
- 3. Your child's homepage will appear and on here will be their reading book(s).

Throughout the books, there are quiz questions for your child to complete. When your child has finished all the quiz questions in a book, they will earn 'Active Learn Coins'. By reading more books, your child will earn enough coins to 'buy' a reward in one of the many reward schemes.

In **Nursery** the children started the week setting up our science experiment. We have now had some plants growing but they were very different. The children could see the difference where plants had no sunlight and water and plants that had sunlight and water. We found that all plants need water to grow but they need sunlight to grow healthy and become green.







KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

In <u>1BG's</u> home learning this week we have been carrying on about our story Argh Spider! We have been finding out about verbs and how we can act them out. Then we had a go following instructions with verbs in them to make our own spiders. Also in our phonics we have been learning about suffixes, adding ed, er, and est to words to change their meaning e.g. walk>walked, hard>harder>hardest.


