

#### KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

#### EYFS

This week in nursery we have explored spooky stories and made lots of magic potions. On Friday we went to forest schools and read the story 'Room on the Broom', we then made our own very special potion collecting various objects around the different areas. We all put the all objects into the magic cauldron and said the magic words 'Iggety, ziggety, ziggety, zoom!!' The morning children created an amazing broomstick and the afternoon children made Mr Smith look very funny. We have continued our Halloween theme this week and have had a wonderful time dressing up in Nursery. Look out for the Spooky Treat Bags coming home with your child.





This week in <u>F2</u> we have been learning about what it is like in a woodland environment. We have learnt about the types of animals that we would find living there and we have talked about stories that are set in a woodland setting...The Gruffalo was a popular choice! We have used woodland objects to create repeating patterns and we have created our own pictures and paintings of woodland creatures. We have then had a very busy few days, as it is time for Robbie Robot to choose where he wants to live! We have learnt about lots of different families and places over the last half term – houses, farms, jungle, arctic and woodland. Robbie Robot asked for the children's support to help him decide where to go. We'll have to wait a see for his final decision...ask your children to tell you where they think he should live and why!

#### KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

This week Year 3 have been learning about maps, direction and using a compass to support our Geography focus. Despite a little rain, the children enjoyed finding North with a compass to initiate the start, then moving in a variety of directions and learning the chat: Never Eat Shredded Wheat (North, East, South, West). Back in the classroom, we searched for Pleasley Pit Country Park using Google Maps in preparation for our trip. This linked in with using a compass and what symbols we need to learn to read a map. Maybe you could download a compass on your phone/tablet to share with your child and 'have a go' at using this over half term when you go for a walk. Using directional language is a hard concept to grasp and any practical help with this will

support your child's understanding.









Year 4 have had an exciting end to the half-term this week! We have concluded our final piece of writing, producing a memoir based on the text 'Escape to Pompeii'. Also, we have had a great time discussing and learning about different Roman artefacts in our Curriculum Vehicle lessons.

All the Year 4 team would like to say a huge well done to both classes for an amazing start to the Year!



Year 2 have been perfecting their food preparation skills ready for our vehicle end outcome on Wednesday. The children really enjoyed chopping, peeling, and grating a range of foods to make some healthy wraps. Their favourite part was tasting their hard work, the wraps were delicious!

#### KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

Year 5 have been learning about the important role of women in WW2 today. We discovered that women had many roles including looking after evacuees, supporting the industry by working in the munitions factories, as land girls and in the forces.



This week in Y5, we have been working hard in Music to learn the lyrics to Livin' on a Prayer. We have now learned all of the song. Look out for our video on Facebook 🙂

The hghlight of the week in <u>Year 6</u> is when the Dojo shop opens. The children look forward to 'Cashing in' their hard-earned points.
