EYFS

EYFS have had a lovely first week back! We have been exploring pumpkins and have enjoyed sharing our experiences of 'Trick or Treating' and dressing up for Halloween (do share your photos to Evidence Me for us to enjoy and add to their learning journey).

This week was also very exciting as we had a very special delivery of a scroll inviting the children to a Royal Banquet that will be held in December. We now need to prepare by learning all about castles, royalty, banquets, knights and dragons.

We shared some images about castles with the children and we were lucky enough to share some lovely pictures from Mrs Bardgett's holiday photos where she visited some fantastic places.

Nursery have used the collections they made over the half term holiday to explore patterns in their Maths sessions. The children have also looked at patterns in words, counting the beats when reading our new book this week Tanka, Tanka Skunk.



KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

Year 1 have started their new vehicle 'Once Upon a Time'. We have explored the story of Rapunzel this week and listened to many different versions. Our link to Science this half term is Everyday Materials, so this week we have been looking closely at what objects are made of and then categorising them accordingly.







Yesterday, Year 2 found a map! A cross was marked on the map so Year 2 headed off to see what they could find. The map took us to the allotment where we found a package; it had some cheese inside! We then used Google to find out what some of the words on the package meant. We found that the cheese was from over 400 years ago! It belonged to a man called Samuel Pepys, he buried his cheese during The Great Fire of London. Year 2 are very excited to start their new vehicle and learn all about The Great Fire of London!





KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have started their new English unit this week – a non-fiction book called "You Wouldn't Want To Be a Victorian Miner", all about being a miner in the Victorian era. We have reminded ourselves about some of the key facts we already know about mining through a quiz, recalling our visit from The Miners Rescue Team and our trip to Pleasley Pit Top and Country Park. It was great to hear the children in conversation about what they could remember!
