

EYFS

This week in EYFS, **Nursery** have been working on their climbing skills as well as being brave. We have explored how to be safe using the large apparatus in the hall. As you can see, some of the children were very brave and were able to climb up very high. The children



continued to develop their movement skills using small movements as well as rolling around building up their core strength. It is fantastic to see children overcome their fears when working with some of the climbing equipment and taking a (safe) leap of faith.







It has also been our final week learning about royalty in **EYFS**. We have been looking at stories about castles and have focused on the story of 'Zog'. We have looked at lots of dragons and were very excited to make our own out of play dough, painting, drawing, bricks and craft materials. This week in **F2**, we have also been very lucky to have been involved in a collaborative art project with Y6 where we created our own Moths and decorated them using paint, salt, pepper and wax crayon. The results were impressive! Christmas starts properly next week in EYFS — we can't wait!

KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

This week in Forest Schools, **Year 1** went on a nursery rhyme scavenger hunt. We had to search for the lines from well known nursery rhymes and then sequence them in order. Some of them were quite tricky but we managed it by working together. It was great fun with lots of snowy boots and rosy cheeks too.



KS2 (Years 3 and 4)



This week in our reading, Year 3 have been looking at advertisements. We have considered the author's choice of illustrations and vocabulary and what effect this has on the reader. When reading about the two different types of trainers the children were overwhelmed by how much the author wanted you to buy

this product. They were able to see just how persuasive a short article can be when you use the right style or choice of words. Maybe you could look and talk about some advertisements on the TV. Ask your child what they are trying to get you to do and how the words or pictures change and influence your ideas.

In Year 4 this week, we have finished off our unit on the Firework Maker's daughter in style by writing some poetry to be performed. The children have worked incredibly hard at using clarity in their voices, eye contact with the audience, hand gestures and some acting. I'm sure if you push them a little, they will give you a small rendition at home.



KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

Year 6 presented their TRIP graduation to a hall full of parents this week. They did a super job of reciting poems, singing songs, and even rapping about friendship and the 'Inbetween Phase'. Simone from the Believe Academy was very impressed.
