


Important messages for this week:






Covid-19: Reporting to School

KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

EYFS

This week in **Nursery**, we have been talking about keeping ourselves sun safe. I know its not hot here, but it is in Australia, which is one of the countries that we have shared with the children. We talked about the type of clothing that we wear to keep ourselves safe in the sun, as well as drinking water. We talked about the weather in Hucknall and how it has been cold outside. We went to Forest School and talked about the animals and how they keep warm. We talked about how they would build homes with warm materials. The children decided to use sticks, leaves and grass to build their homes for the creatures that live in the woods. We also built on our teamwork skills by working together in groups to complete our activity.

In **F2**, to follow on from our learning about snow and sun, we have been learning about rain. We talked about how rain falls from clouds in the sky and spoke about wearing clothing that is waterproof to keep us dry. We listened to the sound of rain and spoke about how this is sometimes called 'white noise' and can be used to help people fall asleep as they find it very relaxing. We then learned about the story of 'Noah and the Great Flood' and spoke about what a 'flood' was. Following the story, we looked at how we could practise our colour mixing to create the colours of the rainbow in order to paint pictures of matching animals to go up on our display of Noah's Ark...the animals went in two-by-two after all! The children also enjoyed creating their own rain shakers using natural materials whilst at Forest Schools. We have had a great week learning about the rain...the best bit...we didn't have any!

KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

This week in our reading sessions, **Year 3** have been reading and asking questions about a very famous poem: <u>On the Ning Nang Nong by Spike Milligan</u>. It is a nonsense poem with lots of made-up words which the children commented on: "It is silly and made me laugh." "It doesn't make sense! What is a jibber Jabber?" "Cows can't go BONG!" We discussed the sound words 'Boo,' 'Ping' and 'Clang' within the poem and discovered that this is called onomatopoeia – words that describe the sound. We have also talked about ways we can perform a poem, using actions, intonation - changing our voice and using musical instruments. This week, **Year 4** have been continuing our vehicle work, building towards making our own electronic board game. In Maths, we have continued to work with fractions and have even been converting these to decimals this week. We also had a great time starting our outdoor adventure unit in PE. We used some cones to make a course and drew a map so another group could complete our course.



On Wednesday, **Year 2** had a surprise activity. Miss Franks joined us from Nursery to build a fire for us. We all sat in the Forest Schools fire circle and watched how quickly our model Tudor houses burnt. We also looked at how quickly the fire spread from one house to the other. This was the culmination of our Great Fire of London work. Year 2 will start their new vehicle next week.

KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

This week, **Year 5** have been learning all about the Sahara Desert and compass points. We had to navigate Bear Grylls and his crew to safety through the desert. In Maths, we have been learning all about improper fractions and mixed number fractions. We are now experts at converting between these!

If you have any shoe boxes, kitchen roll tubes or cardboard, can you please bring these into school by Tuesday.

Year 6 have completed their unit of Reading on the poem, 'The Lady of Shalott' by Alfred Lord Tennyson. Their last task was to think of questions to ask The Lady and to hotseat her. The children had great fun imagining why she was there and who she was. Follow the link below to hear the poem read.
