

EYFS

This week in **EYFS**, we have been continuing







with our focus on different weather conditions...this week has been all about wind! We read a lovely story about a windy day called 'Shark in the Park' which we all really enjoyed and we had great fun in Forest Schools when we made our own wind wands using a stick, piece of string and a balloon. We fastened them all together and then we raced around the outside area seeing if the wind could hold up our balloons! We had a great time and we used our experiences to write a simple set of instructions so that other people would know how to make a wind wand of their own. We added to our lovely displays in our setting by putting up our wonderful rainbow paintings and our circle rainbow paintings in the style of the famous artist, Kandinsky. We have also been investigating what colours we can make by only having three prime colours in our painting area...red, yellow and blue. Ask your children to tell you what they have found out when they mix two colours together.

KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 have worked hard on their persuasive letters to Duncan this week as part of our English unit "The Day the Crayons Quit".

They have used commands: "Stop running. Pick up your pencil, Help me,

persuasive language: "You really do need to help us. But you must listen to our feelings"

and rhetorical questions: Don't you know I'm so tired? Can't you see I'm never used? Aren't you going to help us? How do you think that makes us feel?



We are so pleased you have thought carefully about how to include these new skills in your writing.

This week, in **Year 4**, we have been completing some shape work in Maths. We have located and compared different types of angles and have also been looking for lines of symmetry within shapes. In our vehicle sessions, we have started to make our electronic board games. We've begun to make the playing board and built electric circuits we think will be effective inside our games.

KS1 (Years 1 and 2)







Y1 had a brilliant time on Muddy Monday. We did measuring with rulers, and then a phonics scavenger hunt.



This week, **Y2** made a snake using the plastic from your houses.... As you can see it is HUGE! We decided that we use too much plastic, and we need to take action as a lot of it ends up in our oceans. **Y2** have decided to make a pledge (a promise) together in school to reduce the amount of plastic waste. **We would like you at home to do the same**. KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

This week, **Year 5** have made a 3D Amazon Rainforest, which was very exciting but incredibly messy! The children could label all of the layers of the rainforest and know which animals belong in which layer.

In English, we have produced a newspaper article about Philippe Petit, who walked between the Twin Towers in 1974. The outcomes are fantastic - well done 5IR and 5ED! Also this week, 5IR went swimming in the deep end of the swimming pool and 5ED had great fun playing dodgeball ① After half term, 5ED will be going swimming.

Year 6 have been busy again this week. On Monday, in true Year 6 style, we had a great time because we got to spend the whole morning talking about poo! We were visited by Severn Trent Water who told us all about what we can and cannot put down the drain. It was really interesting to hear how some of the products that we sometimes think are OK to flush can actually cause a lot of damage to our drainage systems. We did a very messy activity where we had to try and separate out all the different things to get back to clean, drinkable water. It wasn't easy at all and some of us got VERY messy!
