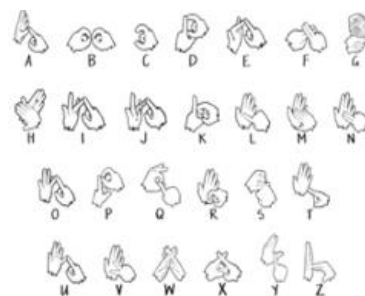

Important Information

Please see the following information about the free seasonal flu spray on offer to all children and young people.

This is happening in school on **Wednesday 2nd November**. You must complete an online consent for each of your children if you wish for them to have it. Our school code is **NG140616**.

It is now time for your child's yearly flu nasal spray!

The free seasonal flu spray is offered to all children and young people

Even if your child received this last year it is recommended, they have it again this year or they won't be protected. With COVID-19 in circulation it is more important than ever to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them and the NHS.

What do you need to do?

You **must** complete **one** online consent form for **each** of your children.

It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray **or not**.

If you decide you want to **withdraw** consent you must email sais@nottshc.nhs.uk at least 24 hours before your schools session.

The nasal spray may not be suitable for some children, for more information visit www.nhs.uk/child-flu

Please note: If any of the following happen **after** completing this form you must contact the School Aged Immunisation Service: If your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, has started steroid tablets for asthma or has had this vaccination anywhere else.

How will the vaccination be given to your child?

We are a team of skilled and experienced nurses and support staff. The flu vaccination is a quick and simple spray up the nose.

Step one: The nurse places the tip of a thin plastic tube just inside the nostril.

The child can breathe normally whilst the vaccine is given.

Step two: Half of the vaccine is sprayed in one nostril.

Step three: The other half of the vaccine is sprayed into the other nostril.

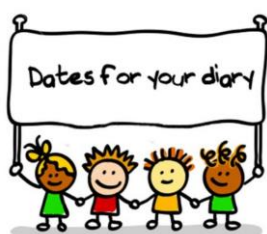

EYFS

In **nursery** during talking points this week we read a book called "when I'm feeling happy" and we spoke about what makes us happy and that we have smiley faces when we are happy. This is what we said..... "I feel happy when Mummy blows bubbles and I catch them" Emilia. "I feel happy when Mummy and Daddy take me to the park" Zayne. "I feel happy when Daddy takes me in his motorbike" Joseph.

Thursday is our Fabulous Physical Skills day session in **F2WS** and **F2SB**. We take all our bats, balls, scooters bikes and trikes out onto the playground. We are developing our balance, large motor co-ordination and hand to eye co-ordination whilst having lots of fun.



KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

In **1RW**, we have been making bird props that are inspired from the story of 'North, South, East, West' that we have been using in our English lessons. It was great fun practising our cutting skills and using feathers to make our birds look interesting.



KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 - Adding multiples of 10's and 100's has been this week's task in maths. We have talked about how the ones will stay the same when we add in multiples of 10 e.g. 25, 35, 45, 55. We have talked about how the tens and the ones will stay the same when we count in multiples of 100 e.g. 125, 225, 325, 425, 525. Here is a website to help you practice this skill with your child.

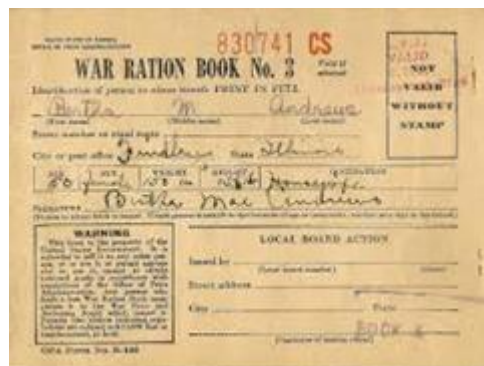
