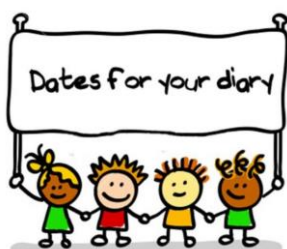

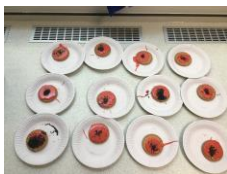

EYFS

Nursery have loved making poppy biscuits to help us understand and remember this important day.



This week we have introduced the children in **F2** to our new vehicle. It is called I wonder what the world was like before I was born. The children were presented with a Royal scroll inviting them to come to a Royal banquet. The children all came dressed looking amazing on Monday and we started learning all about castles. The children have been learning lots of new words including battlements and portcullis. We have been drawing castles, writing words about castles and even making our own creations using a variety of media. We have also visited the library this week and looked at the lovely display at the church of the poppies. We shared how we had different colours for the animals. The children watched a lovely video today and were very respectful while we held 2 minutes silence today.



KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

In maths this week, **year 2** have been learning base 10 and recognising numbers up to 20.



KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

What a great time **Year 3** had in music this week! We are learning to read and play a simple piece of music. It was hard at first to play the notes C & D on the glockenspiels. But after a bit of practice the children improved in their timing and performance.



This week in **Year 4**, the children have been pulling all their amazing knowledge about Roman soldiers together into an information text. You will be able to learn about the lives of Roman soldiers yourselves from our Year 4 historians at our Museum event next month - details to follow.



KS2 (Years 5 and 6)

The children in **year 5** have continued their work on the text 'The Invisible' by Tom Percival this week. They have written a contrasting setting description between Isabel's (the main character's) happy place and unhappy place. The children focused on including lots of grammatical features and positive or negative language depending on the setting they were describing. Mr. Smith and Mr. Gleave were also extremely impressed with the Year 5 PE sessions this week. All children showed amazing bowling skills in cricket and were able to bowl accurately and using the correct technique.

Year 6 - as you are probably aware, our school operates a dojo reward system for positive behaviour, good participation in lessons, team work, kindness, trying hard etc. Each year group decide the rewards they would like as a class and how many dojos they need. Some of our rewards are: a lollypop, Lego playtime, special pen, laptop time, hot chocolate. Dojos can be saved for longer in order to achieve a higher prize eg toastie making session, afternoon in forest school or craft afternoon of their choice. The most popular choice is definitely a cup of hot chocolate, very welcome on these chilly days.
