EYFS

At Forest Schools nursery have made bird feeders using lard, seed, and pinecones. They were very sticky, but we think the birds will love them as it is hard for them to find food in the

winter.





F2 have been working hard learning all about the weather as part of vehicle, 'I wonder if all the world is the same'. This week we have been focusing on 'Rainbows'. Children have looked at how a rainbow appears and how rainbows can be seen around us in our everyday lives. We have shared together that we can see rainbows through colours in the environment, the changing colour of the trees or sand in the mountains. Rainbow colours can be used for religious festivals, they are signs of hope and on flags as a sign of Pride. The children have been exploring colour through experiments. We have been predicting what might happen during our experiments using skittles to make a rainbow using water, juice and milk. We have also shared our knowledge of colour mixing, mixing colours on our hands to find how two different colours make another colour.





KS2 (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3 are trying hard to put more detail into their writing so it keeps the readers interest. We have recapped on using fronted adverbials. This is where something happens, e.g. At the theme park, when something happens, e.g. At midnight, or to show a feeling, e.g. Feeling upset. We have also introduced the children to similes: when we compare two things using as and like, e.g. as fast as a rocket, as quick as a flash, The traffic was so slow, it was like watching a plant grow. Year 4 had Dantastic Education on Tuesday 24th January. In this, they were joined by Nick Tastic, the session lead who gave them lots of new knowledge about the Anglo-Saxons. At the end, the children got to put on helmets and chainmail, and handle the different artefacts, some of which were genuine like an Anglo-Saxon coin that was well over a thousand years old! The children are already using this knowledge in their

work!



KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

This week **Year 2** have been learning all about Florence Nightingale in our Vehicle 'Gruesome Germs'. The children made a timeline of the events in Florence's life. Year 2 are VERY knowledgeable about Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole so make sure you ask them lots of questions at home!





KS2 (Years 5 and 6)


This week the children in **year 5** learned about the Amazon rainforest and created their very own dioramas. Firstly, thank you for sending in the shoeboxes, the children absolutely loved being creative and making a mini rainforest. They learned that the Amazon rainforest is in South America, that it is called the 'lungs of the Earth' as it produces 20% of the world's oxygen and that it is home to 50% of the living species on this planet!

As part of the **Year 6** lessons, we are discussing and investigating the processes involved in the transformation from crude oil through to the making of plastic bottles. We have looked at videos and studied the technical language used. The children have designed their own picture comic strip to help their understanding and added details to a process template.

You can help your child with their phonics at home by reading and writing words containing this phoneme. Don't forget to read as often as you can and record this in your child's reading diary too!






Nursery Rhymes at Holgate
